- 5. Who is one person in your life for whom you find it difficult to "lay down your life" by putting his or her needs ahead of yours? What obstacles stand in the way of you sacrificing on behalf of that person?
- 6. What is one way, large or small, that you can "lay down your life" for that person this week? What can this group do to support you?
